

Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Premium 2018-19

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives state-funded schools, including special schools and alternative provision settings, additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). In the financial year 2018-19 Queen's Croft High School was paid £15,500 in Catch-Up Premium funding. This was spent as follows:

Resource	Approximate Spend	Impact Measure
Enhanced Teaching Assistant Support	£13,000	The provision of additional teaching assistant support has enabled the provision of classes for literacy and numeracy with enhanced ratios of staff to students. This has enabled additional small group work and 1:1 work in developing student skills in literacy and numeracy.
Resources	£1,000	The school has invested in a range of resources to enhance the provision of literacy and numeracy to year 7 students, including materials related to the White Rose Mathematics programme and the intensive reading intervention programme.
Individual Tuition	£1,500	In a small number of cases, 1:1 tuition has been put in place to help students with very specific difficulties to make progress in literacy and numeracy.

The school's internal assessment data demonstrates that year 7 students made good progress in English and Maths in the 2018-19 academic year.
