Dear Parents and Carers,

You will all have heard the Prime Minister's announcement last night that schools will be fully open from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March.

We are currently working through the latest guidance to prepare for this and to make sure that we have all the right safety measures in place. We will finalise our plans over the next couple of days and share them with you by Friday.

Until the 8<sup>th</sup> March, we do need to keep to our current arrangements, so if your child is currently working at home, please don't just send them into school. We need to make some adjustments to our staffing before we can safely manage everyone being back in the building.

If your child is currently working at home and you would like them to have some time in school from next Monday (1<sup>st</sup> March), please let us know by Thursday and we will try to incorporate them into the groups working in school next week.

I know that there will be concerns about keeping everyone safe and we will make sure that our latest safety measures and updated risk assessments are shared with you (on the school website.)

If you have any particular concerns about your child coming back into school, please do let your child's teacher know or contact the school office and ask to speak to Mrs Hewitt (Attendance Officer.) We will work with each of you individually to address your concerns.

The Government's advice is that we still need to work hard to keep everyone safe – we're not at the end of this pandemic yet. Please remember to keep yourselves and your family safe and if you have any symptoms, then make sure you access a test. The virus is still in our locality and could still cause disruption to our plans.
